Submission of recall times

AGL is strongly opposed to the new proposed approach for the submission of recall times as we consider it would be extremely onerous for traders and site operations, with little additional benefit. We consider the current process whereby information is provided under existing ST PASA bids, with extra information either provided upon AEMO request or by generators if there is a change to the return to service time for a unit, has proven to be effective and does not need to be changed.

The new proposed approach would require constant communications between the trading desk and unit operations which would be highly time consuming and costly, and potentially even more challenging for battery energy storage systems.

We therefore request that AEMO not proceed with the proposed change to the generator recall process.
