



Liddell Closure and Transition

Liddell Power Station has been a part of the Upper Hunter for over 50 years, and while its closure will be welcomed by some, it should also be recognised that the power station has employed thousands of people across decades of reliable electricity generation and contributed significantly to the local economy.

Key to our closure strategy has been our commitment to no forced redundancies and the establishment of the Future U Hub, an on-site centre dedicated to supporting our people plan for their future.

As a result of these planning sessions employees have now either opted for redeployment to Bayswater Power Station, are planning for retirement or have chosen to stay at Liddell Power Station to ensure all units can operate safely until full station closure.

Some employees will also form a multi-skilled decommissioning team who will prepare the power station for demolition.

Mental health support has been prioritised through our Future U Hub, with a focus on training that gives our people skills and tools to help manage their wellbeing and mental health during the closure process. This training has also been offered to our embedded contractors.

Financial counselling, superannuation talks and information on retirement support is also being provided, and as Liddell people transfer to Bayswater, leaders are undertaking training on how to successfully form new teams and integrate the two workforces.
