	additional wells are drilled and brought into the network. Additional areas of Sugarloaf, Razorback, El Bethel, Mt Gilead and Springfarm were discussed as future production areas.		
	Approval received from the Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Natural Resources to construct the gathering lines at Glenlee and EMAI.		
	Johndillo Office / Workshop site under rehabilitation.
