Floodlights were<br>adjusted as the complaint was received, however<br>drilling operations had concluded. Noise and light<br>monitoring will be undertaken during the initial<br>drilling of KP06 to ensure compliance.   |  |

| 19-7.3  | DH – Is there any opportunity for AGL to get gas<br>prior to BHP mining coal?<br>MR – <i>Showed map which outlines BHP and AGL's ML</i><br><i>and PEL or PPL's.</i> AGL and BHP have had<br>discussions in the past to see if synergies exist<br>between our businesses. AGL has an initiative to<br>work with mining companies and do pre gas<br>drainage in Queensland and in the Hunter. The<br>number of wells and well density dictates<br>economics. AGL needs to drill in areas with high<br>permeability for gas production and no faults in the<br>seam. |  |
| 19-7.4  | JM- Does AGL have a Flood Management Plan for<br>high flood areas?<br>SB – There is an existing Flood Management<br>Protocol, which is currently being updated in line<br>with a consent requirement prior to commissioning<br>of one of the EMAI wells and this Plan is to be<br>submitted to the Department of Planning shortly.  |  |
| 19-7.5  | MR – AGL can remotely close in well sites from the RPGP plant, and during wet weather operations are shut down and vehicle heavy equipment is minimised to reduce damage to roads.  |  |
| 19-7.6  | DH – Are plugged and abandoned wells marked?<br>MR – Yes – 1m below ground. Casing is removed<br>from mining sections across the Bulli seam for<br>safety reasons, and the co-ordinates are logged and<br>registered with the DPI and the local council. The<br>well hole is filled with cement and capped with<br>steel and marked.  |  |
