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STC and LGC prices since Jan 2012



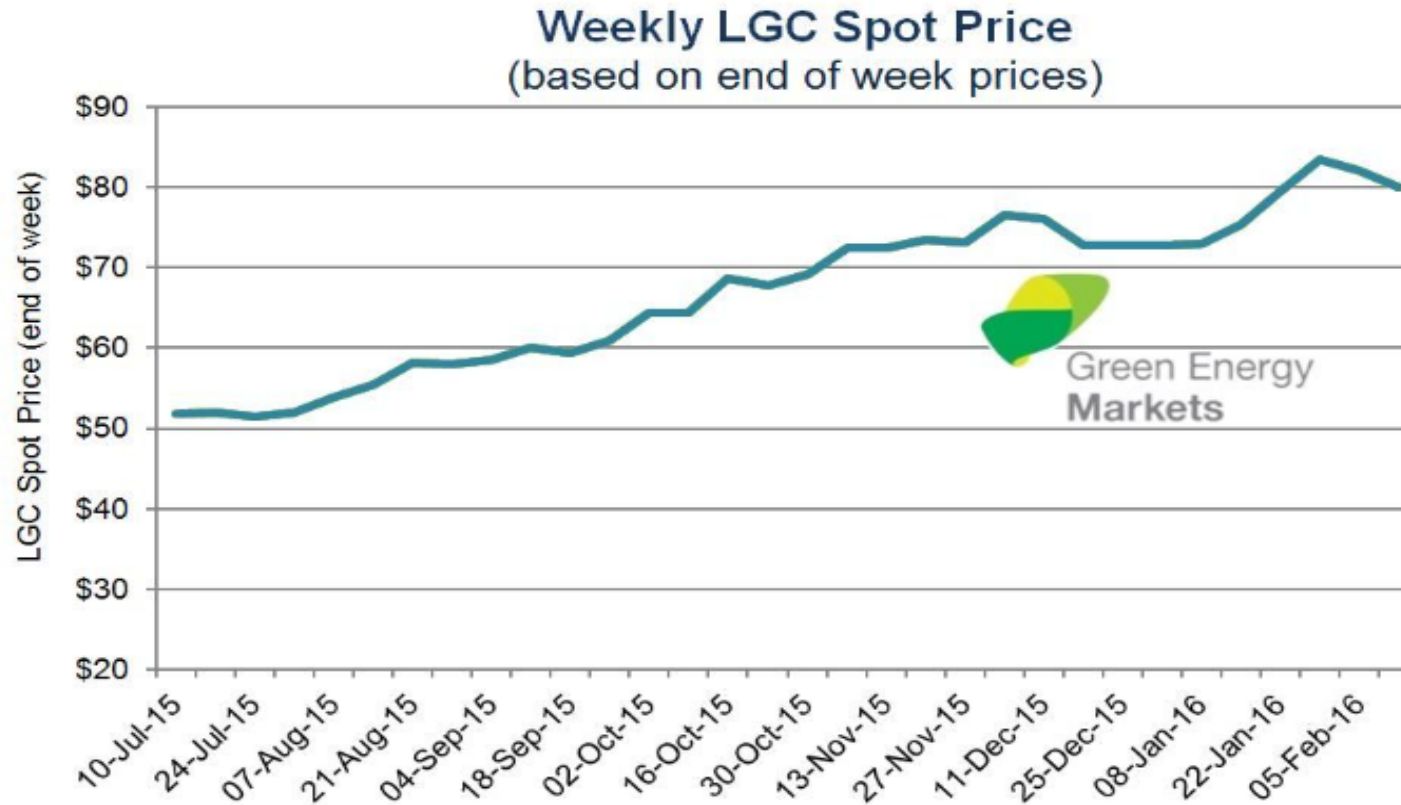
Wholesale spot prices at end of week

2. AGL's Powering Australian Renewables Fund (PARF)

- › AGL launched its Powering Renewable Energy Fund
- › This fund aims to attract investors and to build up the fund to around \$3 billion from institutional investors to support 1,000 MW of mostly renewable energy power generation, including projects such as the Coopers Gap Wind Farm
- › This fund is a big step forward and will provide AGL with more financial certainty around building renewable energy projects
- › The fund is to be established by mid 2016, with projects expected to commence in the following 12 to 24 months

1	Initial Assessment Report (IAR) AGL has gone back to this step	Prepare initial assessment report
2	First public submission period	Comment on the initial assessment
3	AGL to address submissions and prepare a Revised Assessment Report	Prepare a Revised Assessment Report addressing submissions
4	Second public submission period	Revised assessment report available for public comment
5	AGL to address submissions	Prepare final assessment report
6	Final assessment report	Final assessment report forwarded to Minister for decision on designation

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2. QLD Draft Wind Farm State Code Planning Guideline

- › The Department recently released its draft wind farm state code and planning guideline for a second round of public consultation. The consultation period ended mid December 2015.
- › The draft code and guideline based on national and international best practice, expert advice and recent emerging research.
- › The State's primary focus is the health and safety of the community, while carefully considering the wind farm developments against core objectives; liveability, sustainability and prosperity.
