AGL Gas Storage Pty Ltd (AGL) acquired the existing Wallumbilla Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) Facility (the Facility) from Santos QNT Pty Ltd (Santos) in April 2011. As the Environmental Authority (EA) for the Facility formed part of Santos' broader project EA, the EA could not be transferred as part of the sale process and as a consequence the Facility could not continue in operation.

Soonafter the sale was completed, AGL mothballed the Facility by ceasing gas processing and reducing operational requirements to a low level of caretaker maintenance. AGL proposes to recommission the Facility as an integral component to support the withdrawal phase of the Silver Springs Underground Gas Storage Project to process the gas removing the propane, butane and condensate in order to provide sales quality gas to QGC to support its Queensland Curtis LNG Project.

A new EA in accordance with Chapter 5A of the Environmental Protection Act is required to operate the Facility. Please find enclosed Site Specific Application for an Environmental Authority and the supporting information.
