

  - > Traffic Management Plan (TMP) workshop session in early December






## Silverton Community Survey

- Approximately 41 surveys were distributed to the Silverton community and CCC members on 9 August.
- The purpose of the survey was to gauge community reactions to the delay of the project.
- > 8 survey responses received.
- > Survey results including verbatim comments were included in the modification report sent to Department of Planning & Infrastructure.
