

3	Project Update	
3.39.01	BW provided an overview of Tilt. Tilt is the largest owner of renewable energy infrastructure in Australia with 11 sites and will reach 21 gigawatt by 20-30. They have a staff of approximately 130 people based in Melbourne, Sydney, Crookwell, Coopers Gap and the Sunshine Coast, as well as Silverton. They have a focus on increasing community benefit through their asset portfolio and want to be a good neighbour.	
	SM provided a project update and advised there had been grid challenges with Project Energy Connect having an impact on the windfarm by curtailing operations at times. It was noted that during gird connection work conducted by TransGrid recently that there had been blackouts in Silverton as the back-up supply failed for two hours.	
	In terms of performance SM advised that the capacity and wind had been very good. Tilt will be conducting a generator exchange and are getting that approved at the moment. One wind turbine generator has been changed and Tilt are now testing for approval. Advised that there were 12 WTGS to go and this would happen in the first half of 2024.
