This book is about the ways you can pay your **energy** bill.

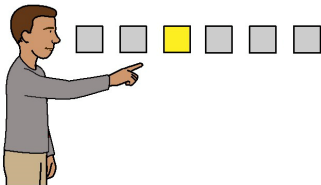


Energy means things like

There might be extra fees if you pay

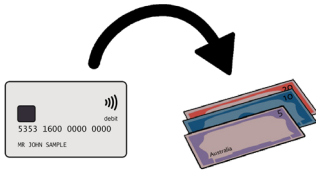
- with a debit or credit card

# 1 Pay with direct debit

You can choose to pay your bill by **direct debit**.



Direct debit means

- we take out money from your account when your bill is due

and

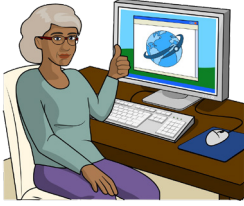


- you do **not** need to do anything to pay your bill each month.



You can stop direct debit any time.

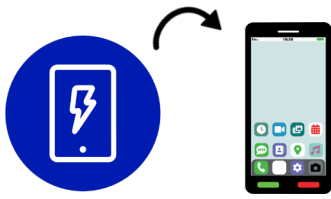
If you are a My Account customer you can log in to My Account to pay your bill.

## 4 Pay on the phone



You can call the AGL payment line anytime.

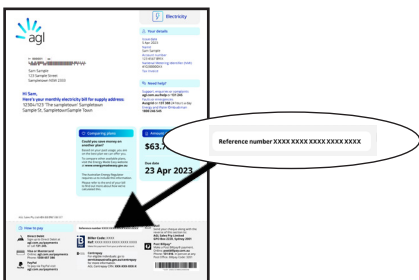


Call 1300 657 386



The AGL payment line plays automatic messages so you do **not** speak during the call.

You will need your payment reference number to pay your bill on the phone.



Your payment reference number is at the bottom on the front of the bill.



Listen to the automatic messages and enter numbers on your phone to give

- your payment reference number



- your payment amount

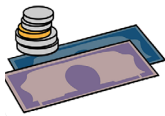


- your debit or credit card number.



## 5 Pay in person

You can pay your bill at the post office with



- cash



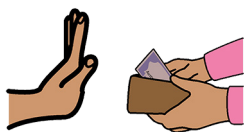
- a debit or credit card.



Remember to bring your bill with you.

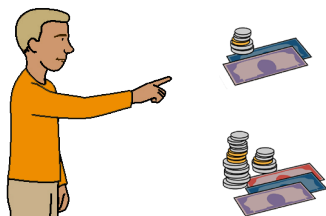


## 6 Pay with Centrepay



Centrepay is a free service.

Centrepay uses money from your Centrelink payments to pay your bill.



You can choose how much money comes out of your Centrelink account each time.

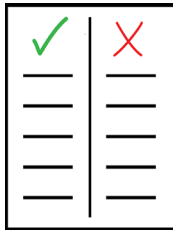

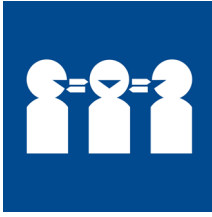
